Stuffing his suitcase with crackers and cheese, he set out on the voyage of hope and promise in the new land. We will begin to envision what we want to do in life, who we want to marry, where we want to live, etc. All of that begins with our ABCs.

When we believe in Jesus, we have ABCs to learn. We have become His new creations of a new order, and so we need to learn what that means. As we begin that learning process, we will begin to see what His purpose is for us, where and how He wants us to be effective in life, and where we are heading. All of this can be learned from the basis of Victory Ground, that is, living in the reality of victory while we are attaining its principles and benefits.

Simply put, Victory Ground is where the Christian lives. Americans live in America, Britons live in England, and Germans live in Germany. Christians live on Victory Ground. Victory Ground is not

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visible in this world, although we find churches where Christians gather, homes where prayer groups and study groups meet. We see symbols on cars and in jewelry that indicate some association with Victory Ground. But to see Victory Ground with the natural eye is impossible.

To begin to reap more of the benefits and privileges of this wonderful place, we will explore how we got there and where it is. Then, and only then, will all its benefits and privileges seem attainable to us.

May the blessings of God fall on you richly and may you discover the joy of Victory Ground.

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Victory Ground Basics

asten your seatbelt as we focus on God's life-changing victory manual! Great vistas will open before your eyes! Get ready for new strength and confidence in God and His power in your life.

Ephesians 2:4-7, the basic scripture for Victory Ground, tells us:

⁴ But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, ⁵ even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), ⁶ and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷ that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

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God's Love and Mercy

God's rich mercy is based on his great love. His love, and therefore His mercy, is based on something outside of our existence and ourselves. The Bible tells us God is love (1 John 4:8, 16). Love is His nature. When speaking about the true God, the God of the Bible, to say, "God is love," is to say real love is God. And because of Who He is, it is natural for Him to extend love to us—even when we were dead in our sins. If God is love, then there are no outside requirements for Him to act in love. Nothing outside of His Being can induce Him to love. He cannot be talked into loving, blackmailed into it, cajoled into it. His love is not based on what anyone can do, has done, or might do. His love is Who He is!

Flowing out of that love, flowing out of Who He is, we find mercy. The Greek word for mercy would be translated something like this: *kindness or good will towards another, joined with a desire to help the person*. Mercy gives us a further understanding of His love. He has kindness that expresses itself in a desire to help. And more than just some mercy, God is rich in it! The origin of the Greek word means *to be filled up with something*." He is filled up with mercy towards us. Furthermore, the Old Testament says, His mercies are new (renewed) every morning (see Lamentation 3:22, 23). If we are to live on Victory Ground, we must change our thinking. We must quit thinking that God is mad at us, doesn't love us, or may not answer our prayers, etc. But rather we must force ourselves, our minds, to believe that God loves us and has great mercy toward us.

Children of Mr. and Mrs. Disobedience

Even when we were dead in trespasses, (God) made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved) (Ephesians 2:5).

God loved us even though we were dead in our sins! That was our before condition, our state of being before God expressed His love and mercy to us. And just what was our before condition? What was our state-of-being? We were, all of us, under the control of the prince of the power of the air (the devil) and were children of disobedience (Ephesians 2:2). Furthermore, we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath (Ephesians 2:3)." This is not a pretty picture!

We were not disobedient children (as to our actions), but we were children of disobedience (as to our nature). That means that no matter how good we were, how kind we were, how nice we were, our father and mother were Mr. and Mrs. Disobedience. All of us had the same parents. Since Adam and Eve disobeyed God, and fell into a state of disobedience, all of their descendants were children of disobedience. That is why every male, every female, is stillborn, *dead in trespasses* (Ephesians 2:5). That is not a warm fuzzy feeling, being controlled by satan, who led Adam and Eve (Mr. and Mrs. Disobedience) into sin. Furthermore, since we were dead in our sins, we couldn't do any-

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thing about getting out of the condition—not any more than a dead man can do anything about getting out of a casket! We were at the mercy of someone else to help us. No other person was interested in helping, and if he were, he couldn't. They, too, were dead! Satan certainly wasn't going to help us; he liked the control he had over us in this condition.

Made Alive!

But God! Hallelujah! Here comes God, Who just happened to be rich in mercy toward us based on the great love He has for us. Not based on us, but on His nature alone! He makes us alive together with Christ Jesus. Even when we were dead, the fact of our deadness didn't bother Him at all. And in our dead state, He made us alive. When His Son Jesus died for our sins, it wasn't enough for God. His intention was not merely to save us from our sins; but rather, to make us alive again. What good is being free from sin, if we remain dead? What good is making a dead corpse rich or pretty or clean? God intended to bring His Son alive from the grave. And, while He was at it, He decided to make the way for everyone who was dead to live—every one of us! He made us alive together with Christ. If you have received the forgiveness of sin that Jesus offers, then this is your present condition. Your before condition was dead, your present condition is alive.

Remember, all that we are saying about Victory Ground must

be preceded by being saved, forgiven of our past, washed by His blood, and made a new person. This is an absolute necessity. Here is how to be lifted up to this new standing of Victory Ground:

If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth, confession is made unto salvation (Romans 10:9, 10).

Given the Best Seat

And look where God has placed us. And (He) raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 2:6).

Not only did He make us alive with Christ, He raised us up with Christ, and made us sit with Him in heavenly, glorious places! Here comes even greater victory. When we believe God raised Jesus from the dead, His resurrection life flows into us and makes us alive. When God seated Jesus on His right hand, He also seated us in the heavenly places with Christ. It had to be, because He is the head and we are His body (see Ephesians 1:22, 23). Where else could we be positioned without severing us from our life-giving head?

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Look Beyond the Physical

Though not physically in heaven with Jesus, we are in reality sitting with Him in heavenly places. Before we get too far in the things of God, we realize that there is more than what we can see with our eyes. In fact, what we see with our eyes may not be real at all. Can you see Jesus? Yet, you know He is with you. His promise is that He will never leave you (see Hebrews 13:5). Not only must we change our minds to believe that God really loves us and has mercy toward us, we must change our minds to the reality of things, which cannot be seen. That brings us to those heavenly places.

The Greek word translated heavenly places is *epouranios* (ep-oo-rah'-nee-os), and strictly means *heavenlies*. We add the word *places* for fuller expression and understanding in the English language. Paul does not say that we are in heaven with Christ, but rather another place—the heavenlies. This is what I call Victory Ground. In Paul's writings, we can easily conclude that though we live in this world, we are not of this world. He tells us in Romans 12:2, ...do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. There obviously is something else besides this world and its habitation in Paul's thinking, and that something is the heavenlies of Ephesians chapter 2.

Your Blessings Are Up Here

The book of Ephesians tells us that our blessings are in the heavenlies (1:3), our head of the church is in the heavenlies (1:20), our arena of operation is in the heavenlies (3:10), and our enemies and weapons of warfare are in the heavenlies (6:12). So it should be obvious that our place of dwelling is in the heavenlies where all of our stuff is (2:6). We are establishing that God has deliberately placed us in the heavenlies, and expects us to stay there.

God has raised us up from death to life—our condition. And He has made us sit together with Jesus—our company. Furthermore, He has made us sit in heavenly places—our location.

That in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 2:7).

Why are we seated in heavenly places with Christ Jesus? Jesus, our head, is seated there, and our blessings from the Father are there. Simply said, God puts us where everything that pertains to us is located. Now isn't that extremely logical? If all your possessions, home, friends, and job were in one state, and you were in another, you wouldn't be much use to anyone—not even yourself. You would probably be saying something like, "Wait till I get home so I can look in my stuff and check this or that out." Or, "Wait till I get home so I can check with my boss." Or, "That tool is in my garage,
